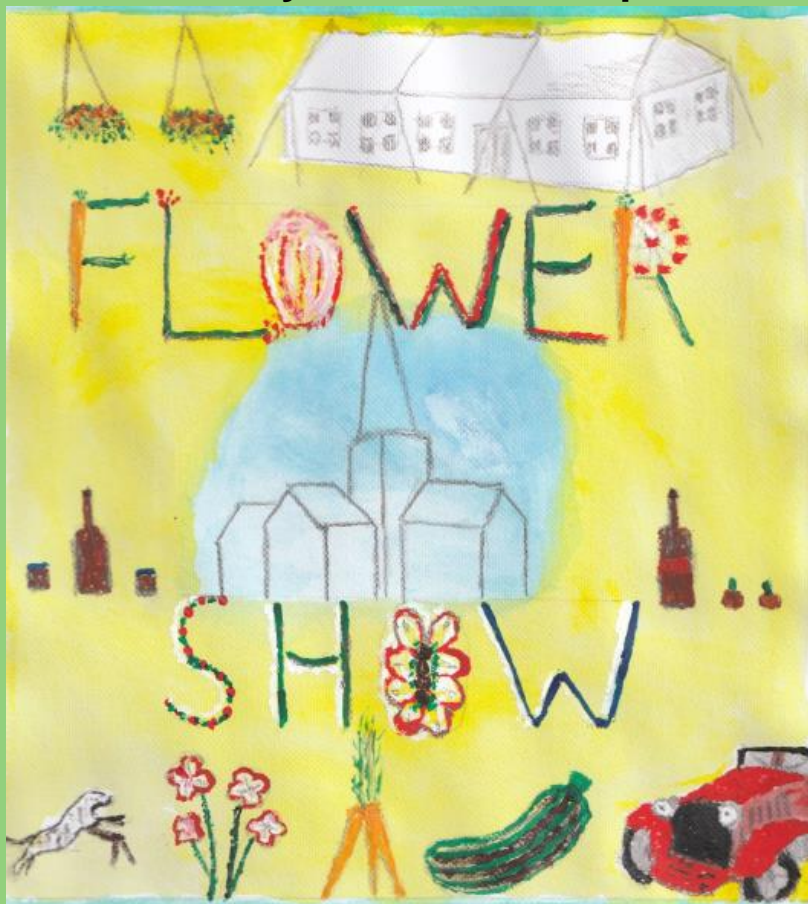

Rules and Regulations

These rules should be read before making an entry into the show

If you need any help with entering your exhibits on the day, there will be people outside the marquee, wearing Sutton Veny Flower Show Lanyards, at the entry table who are there to help you.

The marquee will close promptly at 9.30am for judging. If you have a lot of entries, please make sure you come early enough to place all of your entries in the marquee before it closes for judging.

Please note all classes are open but some trophies are closed and only open to local residents in accordance with clause 1 of the rules below.

- Local Residents: Residents of the villages of Sutton Veny, Norton Bavant, Bishopstrow and Tytherington.
- Entry forms: Entry forms can be returned together with entry fees to Sutton Veny Church Porch at 7-8.30pm 3rd July. Forms may also be handed in to any committee member before 6pm 7th July. Additional entry forms may be obtained from any committee member or from our website. Sutton Veny School will accept entries from pupils during school hours until 5th July 3.30pm.
Absolutely no entries will be accepted after 6pm 7th July.
Each individual entrant must have their own entry form.
- Exhibits:
 - All garden exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and have been in their possession for not less than two months before the show.
 - All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
 - Exhibits MUST NOT be removed from the marquee before 3.30pm and must be cleared by 4.30pm on the show day.
 - All exhibits are displayed at owner's risk.
- Entry cards: Exhibitors may make any number of entries in any one class but may only be awarded one prize. Each entry must have an exhibitor card displayed.
- Displaced or altered exhibitor cards will lead to the entry being disqualified. Exhibitors must leave certificates in place for viewing until 3.30pm. Cash prizes may be collected from any committee member on production of a certificate immediately after prize giving.
- Times of staging: All exhibits must be staged in the show area between 8-9.30am on 13th July. Exhibitors must leave the marquee by 9.30am.
- Judges: The judges shall award the certificates and trophies, and may withhold or divide these. The judges' decisions shall be final.
- Entry fees:
 - Children classes: free
 - All other classes: 50p
- Challenge cups and trophies: All cups to be competed for annually, and to be awarded at the show before being engraved.

The Sutton Veny Flower Show Committees' top priority is the safety of everyone on the show ground, including the welfare of all animals. Therefore, if temperatures are forecast to reach extreme heat on the show day then the dog show will be cancelled. We would encourage you to not bring your dogs to the show if temperatures are extreme and especially not left in cars. Police will be called if a dog is found unattended in any vehicle. Other animal-based attractions will also be contacted and cancelled/reduced in line with the stallholders wishes.

Class 72: Macaroons

Makes: 12 Sandwiched Macaroons (half this recipe if you do not want extras)

Ingredients

125g/4½oz Icing Sugar

125g/4½oz Ground Almonds

90g/3¼oz Free-Range Egg Whites

2 tbsp Water

110g/4oz Caster Sugar

Food Colouring (optional)

Any Flavour Jam for Filling

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 170/C/325F/Gas 3 and line a large baking tray with baking paper.
2. Put the icing sugar, ground almonds and 40g/1½oz egg whites together in a large bowl and mix to a paste.
3. Put the water and caster sugar in a small pan and heat gently to melt the sugar, then turn up the heat and boil until the mixture starts to go syrupy and thickens. If using a thermometer, it should read 115C/239F.
4. Whisk the remaining 50g/2oz egg whites in a small bowl until medium-stiff peaks form when the whisk is removed from the bowl.
5. Pour in the sugar syrup, whisking until the mixture becomes stiff and shiny. For coloured macaroons, add a few drops of food colouring.
6. Tip the meringue mixture into the almond paste mixture and stir gently until it becomes stiff and shiny again.
7. Spoon into the piping bag. Pipe a little mixture under each corner of the baking paper to stop it sliding around.
8. With the bag held vertically, pipe 4cm/1½in flat circles onto the lined tray, about 2cm/¾in apart, twisting the bag after each one. The mixture should be quite loose to give a smooth finish. The piping will leave a small 'tip' on each circle so, when they are all piped, give the tray 2–3 slams on a flat surface to flatten them.
9. Leave to stand for 30 minutes to form a skin then bake in the oven for 12–15 minutes with the door slightly ajar until firm. **Please do not leave the oven unattended during this time.**
10. Remove from the oven, lift the paper off the baking tray and leave the macaroons to cool on the paper.
11. When cool, sandwich the macaroons together with jam.
